Each of the former institutions was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) (1866 Southern Lane, Decatur, Georgia, 30033, Telephone number 404-679-4501) to award Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, and Associate in Applied Science Degrees and Certificates. The three-fold purpose for publishing the Commission's access and contact number is to enable interested constituents (1) to learn about the accreditation status of the institution, (2) to file a third-party comment at the time of the institution's decennial review, or (3) to file a complaint against the institution for alleged non-compliance with a standard or requirement. The accreditation of Coastal Alabama Community College is anticipated at the SACSCOC December 2017 Annual Meeting. ACT Math Foundations

Course Overview: This course will cover the arithmetic, basic algebra, and basic geometry skills students need to be successful of the ACT. The ACT and other standardized tests have a heavy focus on word problems, causing even strong math students difficulty. This course will focus on evaluating word problems and determining the steps required to solve them. Major concepts covered include sequences, percent, probability, basic equations, and geometric figures. In addition to basic problems to teach the skills, students will be provided problems from official ACTs in each category to practice applying the skills. After this course, students will have an understanding of how to interpret and solve word problems.
