The artifacts inside range from arrowheads and other various weapons used by early hunter/gatherers to a whole display on early 19th century pharmaceutical products. Another great feature of the museum is the "Alabama room." This room houses newspapers dating back to the late 1800s, as well as historical and genealogical books from each county in the state. It also serves as the monthly meeting place for Brewton's Historical Society. The museum will soon be expanding its boundaries to include the old technology room, which will allow more displays to be showcased. The museum is definitely one of JD's best kept secrets! Locks of Love asks for a minimum 10 inch hair donation from which 150,000 strands of hair are delicately selected to make each wig separately. These wigs are different from other hair pieces because these wigs are designed to suction-fit to each child's scalp individually, allowing them to swim and even shower with the wigs on. Lady Warhawks Wrap Up Softball Season

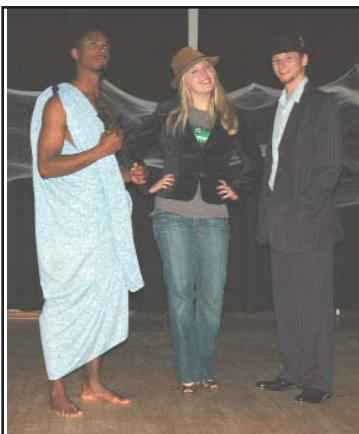
