Graduation Application Deadline Approaches

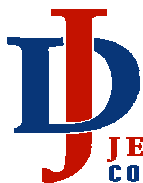
Attention Students! JDCC Registrar Robin Sessions writes: The deadline to apply for graduation for Spring 2009 is: Wednesday, April 1, 2009. This means, if you plan to graduate at the end of this term and participate in the graduation ceremony, you must order a cap and gown and submit a graduation application to the Registrar's Office by this deadline. There is a \$40.00 graduation fee that must be paid at the Business Office before you turn in the application. For your convenience, I have attached the graduation application to a student e-mail that you can simply print and complete. If you are not sure if you are eligible for graduation, please call your faculty advisor to schedule an appointment for a degree evaluation. The graduation ceremony is scheduled for Monday, May 11, 2009 at 6:00pm in the Woodfin Patterson Auditorium on the Brewton Campus. Graduation practice will be Thursday, May 7, 2009 at 1:00pm (in the same location). Student cap and gowns will be distributed during practice. So, don't forget! Apply for graduation by April 1st!
